

Neighbors Driving Neighbors ANNUAL REPORT 2023



After a challenging few years of pandemic and post-pandemic hurdles, we are excited to share that NDN is back, firing on all cylinders. This year has been particularly eventful. Our amazing drivers have traveled 100,000+ miles since NDN was founded. We expanded the service area to include new riders and drivers in Readfield. Darcy Adams joined NDN as a part-time Program Coordinator, increasing our capacity to coordinate

rides and check in with people. We enjoyed the first post-pandemic Driver Appreciation Lunch and the first-ever NDN Donor Appreciation Event, both held at the Viles Mansion in Augusta. In addition, we hosted the Readfield Launch Event, the Annual Online Auction, and the Community Breakfast Fundraiser. It has indeed been a busy year.

While these are all important activities and achievements, the key statistic that we have been monitoring most anxiously over the last year is ride numbers. Many volunteer-based community organizations did not survive COVID-19 as people hunkered down, limiting (for good reasons) the social interactions that are the lifeblood of volunteer organizations. This was also the case for NDN. A year ago the NDN board took a long hard look at our lagging ride numbers and set itself the goal of increasing ride numbers by 50% in one year.

Hence, the very active year. By working with local libraries and aging-in-place committees, getting info into town newsletters, posting on community Facebook groups, showing up with NDN info at local events, and with the help of existing riders and volunteer drivers, we have managed to get the word out that NDN is back. As a result, ride numbers have increased from an average of 35 rides a month for the Jan.–Sept. period in 2022 to an average of 70 rides per month for the same period in 2023. That is a 100% increase! To meet this demand, we are doubling down on recruiting new volunteer drivers and have expanded Darcy's hours so that, together with those of Executive Director Joe Austin, NDN has the equivalent of one full time position.

While it is useful to look at the numbers to confirm that NDN is fulfilling an important function in our towns, it is the personal interactions and stories that drive NDN: stories of companionship, purpose, and a commitment to community—among drivers, riders, and donors.

Many rural communities across Maine struggle with lack of access to transportation, and many have looked to NDN for inspiration. However, they are often doubtful that a volunteer-based model would work for their towns. We should be proud that a volunteer-based organization like Neighbors Driving Neighbors is not only possible, but is also thriving in our communities. It is a sign of a level of trust, good will, and community spirit that make a town a good place to live.

A Year of GROWTH


It has been a year of big changes. In February, we kicked off the year when:

POST PANDEMIC NUMBERS


