something, I know I can call or email Becky for advice or a shoulder to cry on. I call these my 'personal 911 calls.' I always feel calmer after talking to Becky."

Additionally, Jen says that they enjoy solving a problem together. "Becky has been a mentor to me. She's helped me and my son develop better

organizational skills by making suggestions and providing helpful supplies," Jen relates. Their relationship has deepened, evidenced by the thoughtful things that Becky has done to "boost our spirits throughout the year, giving us cards and notes, little treats,

and notes, little treats, birthday and Christmas gifts."

Becky feels the same way. She explains, "It's hard to believe that it has only been a few years that I've known Jen and her son. I care about them deeply. They now have a car, so I will no longer be driving her to various appointments and errands on a regular basis, but I have no doubt that we will maintain our close personal
